#### VII) Special Presentations (20 minutes)

- A. Chief Morris bodycam Feedback Presentation (20 minutes)
  - i. Supporting PowerPoint will be attached to the packet.
  - ii. Chief Morris explained his position as Chief of Police and how it is his job to ensure the safety of students on campus and wanted to introduce himself to the Senate as a person to reach out to with questions or concerns.
  - iii. Chief Morris presented about body warn cameras by police officers.
    - 1. The public is concerned with accountability of police officers, and in response they are obligated to wear body warn cameras to ensure transparency.
    - 2. The cameras are illustrated on the PowerPoint, slide 2 to show how they are turned on.
    - 3. CSU campuses are instating that all police officers on campus will be wearing body warn cameras. This will be a new experience for students, because most interactions with officers will be recorded
    - 4. Pros and Cons list is displayed on Slide 3 on the PowerPoint
      - a. The body warn cameras will promote accountability, and Boost community trust and heighten transparency is the most important benefits.

- b. The most important con is recording investigations of sexual assault and domestic violence, because these cases are very sensitive. There are going to be policies in place to ensure that the police do not "revictimize" victims
- 5. The Senate asked Chief Morris questions that raised discussion.
  - a. The senate inquired about who would have access to the body cam footage. Chief Morris ensured that the person who works on editing the footage will be held accountable for their position. Reason that the footage will need to be edited is due to confidentiality, where the victim can request full recorded footage whereas the suspect and public will only have access to a limited reported version. The footage will be uploaded to Evidence.com where there is already a law enforcement system in place.
  - b. The Senate inquired about the officers' ability to activate and deactivate their body camera while they're on duty. Chief Morris relayed that not all interactions with the public will be recorded. Interactions will be recorded when police officers have a call to address, when they are investigating, and taking enforcement action with the general public. Chief Morris revealed a training issue where on high risk calls officer's adrenaline can affects their ability to activate the body cam since they are under stress and may forget to record.
  - c. Vice President Mumford inquired about other CSU's and which Universities already use body warn cameras. Chief Morris relayed that CSU San Jose started using body warn cameras last summer, and many other CSU's are in the progress of enforcing body warn cameras.
  - d. The Senate inquired if the body warn cameras can be used to find probable cause to go investigate. Chief Morris relayed that the body camera footage is not enough to fully perceive "what happened" therefore probable cause will not be enforced primarily on body camera footage.
  - e. The Senate inquired about the ability to turn on the body camera "remotely." Chief Morris relayed that it is possible to turn the camera on from the office, but that they will not use this ability due to CSU policies and privacy.
