VII) Special Presentations

- A. Changes in Academic Affairs (Senator Lincoln 20 minutes)
  - i. Supporting document will be emailed along with the packet.
  - ii. Senator Lincoln presented about the New GE requirements.
    1. Senator Lincoln recommended everyone to look into their CARR Report to understand the new GE requirements, and how it will affect them.
    2. Senator Lincoln referenced the new list of GE requirements.
    3. Senator Lincoln recommended students to take language, POLS 150, Math, and English during their first semester, because those classes count in multiple categories for GE requirements.
    4. Senator Lincoln relayed that Communications, Psychology, Business, and Liberal Studies majors will benefit more from the old GE requirements.
      - a. Vice President Mumford asked if the change in GE requirements is due to the fact that STEM majors take longer than four years to graduate because they have more upper division classes to take.
        - i. Senator Lincoln said yes.
        - ii. Vice President Mumford asked how long students will have the ability to revert back to the old GE requirements.
          1. Senator Lincoln informed that there isn't a time limit.

- i. Back to Basics Rally new updates (Vice President Mumford 15 minutes)
