- b. Executive Reports:
 - i. President's Report (A. Rugerio)
 - 1. Presentation tis included at the end of the minutes.
 - 2. National Hispanic heritage month is from September 15-October 15.
 - 3. President Rugerio went over the points in their presentation which talked about various meetings, briefly introduced CSSA (California State Students Association).

 - a. INFORMATIONAL ITEM: CSSA Overview (A. Rugerio)
 - i. Presentation is included at the end of the minutes.
 - ii. The California State Student Association is a student-led organization comprised of 7 committees (Finance, Student Trustee, Internal Affairs, Systemwide Affairs, Audit, Legislative Affairs, and the Board of Directors). President Rugerio serves on the Board of Directors and Director Quinonez serves on the Systemwide Affairs Committee and the Legislative Affairs Committee. Their goals are to advocate for the needs of students on the systemwide, state, and federal level to benefit students in policy making focused on higher education. The Student Government President and Director of External Affairs from all 23 CSU campuses attend.


