- 4) Public Forum:
  - a. *R. Beigel-Coryell*: October 6 is California Clean Air Day and CSUCI has a pledge that is specific to the campus (at cleanairday.org/pledge/individual/csuci as well as in the LinkTree of @sustainabilityatcsuci on Instagram).       - Had an office hour with Russell Winans from Clubs and Organizations and was updated on the indoor guidelines they must follow.   - The tabling event that was held on September 27 and was a great way to promote sexual health and see what other issues the student body wants to see Student Government advocate for and allowed for good conversations to happen with students who attended.
- d. DISCUSSION ITEM: Intern Training (A. Trejo)
  - A presentation was given about the best way for the Senate and Executive Team to work with Interns, such as their roles as listed in the Bylaws, their importance, tips on how to work with them, and important things to keep in mind while working with them. 
