    - i. President's Report (A. Rugerio)
      - 1. A presentation was provided for the President's Report (included at the end of the minutes) illustrating a weekly update.
        - a. Two collaborative reports (between President Rugerio and Director Quinonez) were submitted to CSSA (Cal State Students Association) regarding the 21-22 CSSA Policy Agenda Idea Forms, which is utilized to provide ideas on what CSSA and the CSUs as a whole should focus on this next year.
          - 100 civic points were awarded for each one, which are a way to encourage campuses and their student bodies to be more civically engaged.
        - b. Both President Rugerio and Director Quinonez will be attending this month's CSSA Monthly Plenary (September 11 at 9:00am), and any interested students are encouraged to reach out to either one (aurora.rugerio235@csuci.edu or emily.quinonez151@csuci.edu).

      - A Campus Clean Up is happening on September 25, starting at El Dorado Park at 9:00am. This event is a collaboration between the Green Generation club, Student Government, Sustainability Department, and Clubs and Orgs Department. - President Rugerio also met with the Round Mountain Working Task Force to continue organizing the Mt. Satwiwa trail cleanup. They are currently looking into more details and hope to have special speakers from the Chumash community at the event.
  - a. The event will be September 18 from 8:00am-12:00pm. Graphics and more details are to be communicated from the University.
- 4. Emails to interested students from the Clubs and Orgs. Fair were sent out. The final slide in the presentation is a QR code that when scanned will take the individual to the updated eligibility form.
- 5. Any interested students is encouraged to reach out to President Rugerio and Vice President Ramprasad where they will then fill out the ASI Eligibility form and finally have a quick interview to find out more about the open positions and how they potentially fit in Student Government.

  - 1. Vice President Ramprasad also had a presentation (is included after President Rugerio's).
    - a. Updates on their work with their IEAT 4 Committee were shared.
      - i. Highlights include that they committee is working to create a new plan surrounding diversity and inclusion, and how to execute it on campus. The group is working on conducting and collaborating in order to enhance culture by having a biannual climate survey. They also plan to highlight the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) accomplishments through potentially The CI View student news or other formats; possibly a celebration. There is also a plan to evaluate how individuals are being impacted by cultural taxation personally and professionally.


