 - Throughout all of June, President Rugerio and Vice President Ramprasad attended trainings and sat on IEAT Committees 1, 2, 4, and 6. (Inclusive Excellence Action Teams are made up of faculty, staff, and a student representatives to better improve the inclusivity, among other things on campus)
 - In July, Director Grace, Director Quiñonez, and Chief of Staff Trejo joined President Rugerio and Vice President Ramprasad for trainings and took over seats on the IEAT committees (Director Grace to serve on IEAT Committee 1, Director Quiñonez on 2, President Rugerio on 3, Vice President Ramprasad on

4, and Chief of Staff Trejo on 6). The team also met with various campus partners to explain this administrations goals and how to increase engagement.

- 3. During the beginning of August, the team also cleaned up and organized the Student Government office. The team brought 6 students to attend the virtual CSUnity, hosted by the Cal State Student Association (CSSA). President Rugerio and Vice President Ramprasad met with Interim President Yao and Celina Zacarias to discuss their goals.

 - i. A. Rugerio and V. Ramprasad gave a presentation on their "Unify, Co-Exist, Empower" initiative (presentation to be included at the end of the minutes).
 - 1. A few of the general goals for *unify* include promoting Dolphin Pride, establishing relationships with clubs and organizations, promote initiatives against injustices that will benefit students at large. The administration's goals for *co-exist* are to advocate for ethnic studies, support IEAT committees and their efforts to bring more diversity to the university, and to improve sustainability to better co-exist with the land. To encourage *empowerment*, they want to continue to look into current legislation in regard to higher education and see what CSU Channel Islands will advocate for, and finally utilize social media and Zoom backgrounds to bring awareness to important discussions and holidays.




