  - For graduates and credential, students must have a minimum of 3 units completed at Cl.
- Student Government Senator/ASI Board Director
  - For both undergraduates and graduates, the students must maintain a 2.5 GPA and above and be in good standing with the university.
  - For undergraduates, the students must have a minimum of 6 units completed at Cl.
  - For graduates and credential, students must have a minimum of 3 units completed at Cl.

### Candidate Platform

Since the start of the pandemic, there has been an increase of hate crimes toward our AAPI communities.

Terms like "China Virus", "Kung Flu", etc. feed into the racism and violent crimes aimed against AAPI communities.

According to CBS News, there were more than 2,800 self reported hate crimes between March and December of 2020.







### Combatting the harmful "Model Minority" Myth

The model minority myth is an anti-Asian tool created by white supremacy to undermine anti-Asian racism.

It was first associated with Japanese Americans in an attempt to forget about the illegal incarceration of Japanese-North Americans during WW2 by perceiving them as "successful."

By positioning Asians as "model minorities," the myth has also used Asians as "proof" that people of colour can "make it" if they tried "hard enough."

This has rendered Asians to be perceived as close to whiteness, and therefore under suspicion. It's a tool that pits racialized groups against each other, targetting other people of colour as "too lazy" and perpetuating anti-Blackness and anti-Indigenous settler colonial complacency.
