 - Still a need to reallocate financial resources



ISSUES WITH TIMELYMD

So far...

- No oversight structures
- Not unionized
- Students cannot access information on counselors they meeting with
- Cal Poly Humboldt queer students report TimelyMD sessions were negative, and felt their identities were dismissed
- Violated Higher Education Employer–Employee Relations Act (HEERA)

AMENDED IN SENATE FEBRUARY 22, 2023

SENATE BILL

No. 11

Introduced by Senator Menjivar

(Coauthor: Senator Stern)

December 5, 2022

*An act relating to the California State University.
An act to add Article 6 (commencing with Section 89360) to Chapter 3 of Part 55 of Division 8 of Title 3 of the Education Code, relating to the California State University.*

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 11, as amended, Menjivar. California State University: mental health ~~services: contracting out:~~ *counseling.*

Existing law establishes the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University, as one of the segments of public postsecondary education in the state. The California State University comprises 23 institutions of higher education located throughout the state.

~~This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact future legislation that would restrict contracting out for mental health services~~

SUBJECT: A Sense of TimelyMD

WHEREAS, the Associated Students (A.S.) Board of Directors of Cal Poly Humboldt is the single recognized voice for over 6,500 students; and,

WHEREAS, the Mission of the Associated Students of Cal Poly Humboldt serves to "assist in the protection of rights and interests of the individual student and the student body," and to "stimulate the educational, social, physical, and cultural well-being of the University community"; and,

WHEREAS, Cal Poly Humboldt Contracted telehealth services for students in the Spring of 2023. The service, contracted with TimelyMD provides 24/7 emergency counseling and health services, counselor and psychiatrist appointments, summer sessions, and does not count towards students session limitations to in person counseling.

WHEREAS, "CFA filed an Unfair Practice Charge (UPC) with the California Public Employee Relations Board (PERB) stating that Cal Poly Humboldt violated the law by making a decision to contract out CFA-represented work before it bargained with CFA over its proposal."

WHEREAS, students of the association have relayed concerns with the values and culture of TimelyMD and it has been relayed queer students had negative interactions with counselors where their identity was dismissed and their personal health was affected as a result of that interaction.

- Cal Poly Humboldt ASI is in the process of implementing a resolution denouncing TimelyMD
- Passed by ASI Senate
 - Currently being challenged by ASI Board of Directors
- TimelyMD representatives were invited to ASI BoD meeting
 - Multiple students (representing over 5 CSU campuses attended to further express negative experiences and thoughts with the matter)
