# Need for Additional CAPS Funding



- Average wait time is 3-5 weeks

- Only 4 licensed, contracted clinicians
  - Failing to meet APA standards

- **ZERO** licensed psychiatrists
  - Contract ended last semester

- CSU system is not legally required to give students health insurance

# Why Pull from UPD?

UPD is not required to be trained on how to handle sexual assault of folks from the LGBTQ+ community

UPD does not support survivors in their healing

Policing in universities has historically been used as a colonial tool of oppression and criminalization of the BIPOC community

Over the last ten years police officers have killed 1,000 people per year, most being unarmed Black and Latinx people

population
