"Title IX Fails Us" campaign
Demands

1. We demand that you remove the holds on student accounts as a result of not completing the Title IX training. Implementing such punitive measures during an active investigation into the CSU's application of Title IX obfuscates the underlying cause of the problems associated with Title IX and shifts an undue amount of burden onto the shoulders of an already overwhelmed student body.
2. We demand that you redefine what makes a student eligible for an alternative to the Title IX training. Although alternatives do exist, they should be accessible to a wider range of students, especially those who struggle with completing the current mandatory training.
3. We demand that you provide sufficient funds for our Title IX Office to fully comply with the CSU executive order mandates and disclosure notice. Executive Director of Equity & Inclusion, William Nutt, requests a minimum of 2 additional staff members (bringing the staff from 2 to 4) to match the student demand of Title IX services. Increasing the staff of our Title IX office will allow them to complete investigations in a timely manner while providing full due process to which students are entitled.
4. We demand that there is more transparency and awareness for DASS students' options, resources, and reasonable accommodations that are available to them, to better access Title IX services and programs.
5. We demand that policies within Title IX and the institution be put in place to directly protect students from having their first amendment rights violated, and from being retaliated against in the event of complaining about Title IX services.
