5) Public Forum:

a. No members of the public addressed the Senate at this time.

6) Special Presentations:

- a. Dean Amy Wallace:
 - i. Last year, I came to Student Government, and after receiving feedback, I want to tell you what we have changed in the library. We can now link print reserves to Blackboard, textbooks are on print reserve, more laptops are on weeklong checkouts, more money has been allocated to digital equipment, a new website will be out this summer, pleasure reading is being ordered for e-format, the Library Research Award and Archive and Special Collections have been created, etc. My first question to you is how can we make the library more inviting?
 - ii. Ms. Newcomb: Utilize the third floor.
 - iii. Mr. Villanueva: Have more weekend hours.
 - iv. Dean Wallace: We had to cut back weekend hours due to furloughs but we're typically open those days.
 - v. Ms. Bingham: Designate quiet areas.
 - vi. Dean Wallace: That's an on-going concern. We converted the other computing lab to a quiet lab, but the architecture of the building is difficult to keep quiet. What services could the library add that would help students?
 - vii. Mr. Bernardo: Simply swiping our cards instead of having the barcode sticker would be beneficial.

- viii. Mr. Keaster: Promote more throughout the English and math classes about what the library offers.
 - ix. President Neira: You should mention that you can rent laptops.
 - x. Mr. Keaster: People don't' know that you can check out video cameras, projectors, etc.
 - xi. Dean Wallace: What digital equipment could be added?
- xii. President Neira: I think ones that work. I've gone in there and rented a laptop that doesn't turn on or let me log in, so that's frustrating.
- xiii. Dean Wallace: If you don't log into the network before leaving campus, they won't turn on.
- xiv. Mr. Dowling: Can you have video cameras that allow flash drives?
- xv. Ms. Gradillas: Having flash drives available for students would be nice.
- xvi. Ms. Garcia: Maybe get more of the Nikon digital cameras.
- xvii. Ms. Wamba: Getting newer DVDs would be great.
- xviii. Ms. Newcomb: You could even do a DVD exchange.
- xix. Dean Wallace: What resources could be added to help students?
- xx. Ms. Newcomb: Textbooks on reserve would be beneficial.
- xxi. Dean Wallace: That's an on-going issue every year. Textbooks are expensive. We don't have a line in our budget for purchasing the materials. We want to utilize electronic textbooks and encourage faculty to give us a copy of their textbook.
- xxii. Mr. Keaster: At the end of the semester, could you have a donation spot for the textbooks that which aren't going to be sold back?
- xxiii. Mr. Dowling: If they're switching editions, the bookstore won't buy them back. The library can put it in the general collection.
- xxiv. Ms. Cleverly: Is there a way to get research articles that aren't just the abstract and the title?
- xxv. Dean Wallace: We have one of the best electronic companies in the system but the problem is the copyright. We're doing more demanddriven loans.
- xxvi. Mr. Dowling: Is there an option to search multiple databases at once?
- xxvii. Dean Wallace: There is that option already. The information desk can help you. What do you think would make library staff approachable?
- xxviii. Ms. Wamba: I think they should walk around to the computers and ask if we need anything.
 - xxix. Ms. Garcia: I don't want to be approached by staff. Maybe have a table that says "How Can I Help You?" There could be information sheets and staff standing in that area.
 - xxx. Ms. Bernardo: Maybe have an event where students could come to the library to meet the staff.
- xxxi. Ms. Cano: Do they wear nametags?
- xxxii. Dean Wallace: Some do, some don't.
- xxxiii. Ms. Gradillas: Could they wear a uniform or shirt?
- xxxiv. Ms. Newcomb: I love the library, but sometimes the printer runs out of paper or lost-and-found items are asked for and not found. Sometimes the student assistants don't communicate well together.

xxxv. Dean Wallace: I have to give the disclaimer that the printing and copying has nothing to do with the library. We try and put paper in there but have no control over it. If you think of any other suggestions, please email me at amy.wallace@csuci.edu and I work at the Reference Desk every Monday morning from 8-12 P.M.

b. Christina Miranda:

- i. I am a Sociology major here at CI. I also work at Casa Pacifica. I'm an advocate for foster care youth. We have a graduation celebration for all the youth when they turn 18. We do not have the funding this year to make this celebration happen. We are making a committee this year which will get donations, run by John Franklin. The first meeting is on Friday, February 18, 2011.
- ii. Ms. Cano: How would we serve in the committee?
- iii. Ms. Miranda: We divide the tasks among the people. A task would be assigned to you. If you wanted to do a towel, sheet, or gift card drive, that would be helpful.
- iv. Mr. Bernardo: Who would be the contact for the committee?
- v. Ms. Miranda: For now, that would be me, and then John Franklin.
- vi. President Neira: One idea we have is that we could do a shirt exchange here at CI. A person can bring a new shirt to give away and we'll give them a CI Pride shirt. When is the graduation?
- vii. Ms. Miranda: The prom is in June, so we have some time.
- viii. President Neira: This is one of many ideas we'll come up with.

 - 1. Mr. Dowling: I was asked by a student if there's a difference between Maximus and the Student Leadership Awards. I had a hard time telling the difference to the student. Can you tell me?
 - 2. Mr. Keaster: In Maximus, only students can submit nominations. In Student Leadership Awards, anyone can choose.
 - 3. Ms. Thompson: I could submit a nomination for Maximus for a student, but not faculty, staff, community member, or administrator. The Student Leadership Awards are selected by a selection committee that has one student on it. Maximus is an awards ceremony for the students by the students.

7) Discussion Items:

a. ASI Partnership Program:

- i. Mr. Dowling: The ASI Partnership Program is a joint effort between the four ASI entities to transfer advertising and funding from each individual entity to one joint program where we would get sponsors. Student Government doesn't use a lot of outside advertising.
- ii. Ms. Bingham: Could you give examples from other entities?
- iii. Mr. Dowling: The Yearbook has advertisements in the back that businesses could pay for and their name would be shown.
- iv. Ms. Newcomb: We could possibly get someone to sponsor our ASI elections.
- v. Ms. Cleverly: There's the Young Professionals Program in alliance with the Chamber of Commerce who could maybe do something.
- vi. Ms. Newcomb: For the Rootbeer Pong event, you can get Mothers Against Drunk Driving to tie their name to it.
- vii. Ms. Cleverly: What advertisements are we going for?
- viii. Mr. Dowling: A local business will pay a certain amount of dollars and we'll provide advertising for them.
- ix. Benjamin Wilson: What about your Block Parties? If a company gave a donation to this event, they could set up a booth at the Block Party where they have access to the student body.
- x. Mr. Bernardo: The largest event I can think of is Maximus. Then we have to consider the logo and how we would promote the business.
- xi. Mr. Dowling: We're wary to put an outside logo on Maximus. What about other events like Pizza with the President or Donuts with Doc?
- xii. Mr. Bernardo: Also, there have been a lot of opportunities that we have missed in Sacramento because we have no transportation, so maybe we could use the business to pay for that.
- xiii. Mr. Keaster: We could have a I Heart CI shirt with company logos making the letters.

b. CSSA Update:

- i. Ms. Bingham: This weekend, President Neira and I went to CSU Chico. We're looking at a 2.5% enrollment cut per campus. They're starting up the Made in the CSU Campaign promoting the fact that you came out of the CSU system. We'll get shirts and promotional items for it. There's the CSSA Greenovation Fund for sustainability.
- ii. Ms. Garcia: It's a smaller-scale fund of only up to \$1000 and the deadline is on Friday.
- iii. Ms. Bingham: CHESS is coming up and we need to register.
- iv. President Neira: It's mandatory for people who are going to be in Student Government next year. I'm going to try to pull some newly elected officers to attend, too.
- v. Ms. Cano: What are the dates?
- vi. President Neira: We would be driving up there, so April 15-18, 2011. Last year, we had people who stayed on Monday.
- vii. Mr. Bernardo: The whole reason we have it go until Monday is so you can go talk to legislators in the capital during the work week.

- viii. President Neira: Another thing we touched upon is March in March which is on March 14, 2011. We want to get a couple of vans, leave here at midnight, lobby during the day and drive home. If we don't do that, we could do a letter writing campaign and fly some people out there and back.
 - ix. Ms. Cleverly: Which would be more effective?
 - x. Mr. Bernardo: I'd say letters. They have thousands of students that go up for March in March. If we do a letter-writing campaign, we can get more of our students involved.
- xi. Mr. Dowling: Having done work in Congressional office, I'll tell you that letters are very ineffective. Person to person is more beneficial.
- xii. President Neira: We're going to send people up there, regardless. It just depends on how many.
- xiii. Mr. Dowling: Which will be most beneficial? Having forty plus people in an office or letters? What is traditionally done?
- xiv. President Neira: It's growing exponentially. We're not going in any offices. It's just for the march. How many people would want to go up? You'd be gone the entire Monday.
- xv. Ms. Bingham: We'll talk about it and look in our budget. Regardless, we'll be participating, whether it's up there or down here.
- c. Grass Roots Movement
 - i. Ms. Newcomb: I talked to Michelle Miller about this. We were thinking of doing a poster with a question mark and Student Government's name and saying where our office is located. I also talked to her about the "Ask Me!" shirts and she thought maybe we could all paint the shirts. I talked to Ms. Thompson about getting the posters on the display boards in the Student Union.
