- a. ACTION ITEM: Senator Re-Appointment (*E. Conde*)
 - i. Kevin Munoz– Senator of Student Engagement
 - 1. Senator Munoz previously served as the Senator for Veterans and Non-Traditional students and did an outstanding job in that role. We are now reappointing him as Student Engagement Senator, as he is deeply involved in student engagement on campus through his work with Student Programming Board. His experience and dedication make him an excellent fit for this position.

 - b. ACTION ITEM: Senator Appointments (*E. Conde*)
 - i. Ash Bohn-Reinhardt – Senator of Veterans/Non-Traditional
 - 1. Ash Bohn-reinhardt interned last semester for this position, gaining firsthand experience with the needs and challenges of the community. It is extremely important to have either a Veteran, or someone closely connected to the community in this role to truly understand the unique hardships veterans and non-traditional students face. Ash is also a non-traditional student with a prior military career and leadership experience, bringing wisdom, perspective, and a strong sense of advocacy to Student Government. Ash would be an excellent fit for this position.

ii. Jay Paz– Senator of Sports/Rec. and Wellness

1. Would like to appoint Jay Paz as our Senator for Sports/ Rec. And Wellness. Jay previously served in the Senate at the beginning of the semester but had to step away due to scheduling conflicts. Since then, he has served as an Associate Justice, where he has consistently demonstrated commitment, reliability, and passion for Student Government. Jay has shown strong dedication to his work, and his engagement for student involvement makes him a great fit for this role.

c. ACTION ITEM: Suspend SG Bylaws (*R.Banda*)

i. Section 4.2.2 (a) i.-1 Minimum Qualifications of Chief Justice

1. States that no person can hold the Chief Justice position of Student Government unless that person has completed a minimum of twenty-four units of course-work, has completed a minimum of twelve within CSUCI.

Discussion:

Senate inquired about the Chief Justice to ask about senate

Yield time: E. Conde clarified that the Chief Justice would need to attend Wednesday senate meetings and similar to the process of Vice President is to Senators, is how the Chief Justice would be with the associate justices as they would hold their own meetings as part of the Internal Affairs Committee

Senate: Inquired what a suspension would look like moving forward. It would be best to keep the ball rolling.

Senate: Inquired why to suspend them instead of taking it out of the bylaws

2. Chair: Clarified why this could be good because we could have more applicants to fill these vacancies which would assist in reviewing and editing the bylaws
3. Yield time to Advisor Alatorre: explained that the topic of discussion is that candidates don't meet the requirements, so they want to open it up and make it more accessible rather than limiting them.

d. INFORMATIONAL ITEM: CSSA (*E.Conde, C.Pelletier*)

1. The CSU Strategic Plan, CSU Forward, focuses on four major pillars:
2. Economic Mobility Engine the CSU aims to drive upward mobility and strengthen California's workforce.
3. Sustainable Affordability to ensure access and equity, the CSU plans to do multiple things, like increase graduation rates.
4. Employer of Choice in Public Higher Education, the CSU is committed to improving employee engagement and retention. As well as enhancing workplace satisfaction and excellence.

5. Maximize Statewide Impact the CSU plans to do multiple projects including; secure increased legislative support through unified advocacy.
6. Internal Affairs is currently revising past policies to assess whether updates or changes should be made before the end of the semester.
