c. ACTION ITEM: Revisions to Bylaws Regarding GPA Eligibility (Article I – Introduction, Part 2: Eligibility Requirements, Page 3)

1. The Chancellor's office lowered the GPA eligibility from a 2.5 to a 2.25 during the summer 2025
2. This allows ASI Student Government to match or exceed the 2.25 GPA requirement
3. ASI Student Government may choose to match the new requirement or adopt higher standards

Discussion:

1. It was explained to Senate that this was introduced after Covid to help people who fell behind due to the shutdown.

2. Senate wanted to give this opportunity to help students participate in Student Government.
