1. CSSA Applications to become a 2026-2027 Executive Officer are now open.
 2. CSSA asked a question to campuses within each region "Have there been any updates on your campus relating to HSI/MSI grant cuts? Has your university been heavily affected? Are they making drastic changes? If so, how do they plan to make up for losses in the upcoming years."
 3. Some campuses mentioned increasing ASI Fees to help students more, and some are thinking of running a referendum.

b. INFORMATION ITEM: Advocacy Day (*E. Conde*)

1. Represented California State University Channel Islands during CSU Budget Advocacy Day.
2. Advocated for CSU funding priorities and student needs.
3. Met with state legislatures to discuss issues impacting CSU campuses.
4. The CSUCI Attendees included: Intern University President (Andrzejewski) , Director of Community & Government Relations (Celina Zacarias).
 - i. Discussion:
 - ii. Senate inquired if bathroom facilities need funding because of the strike happening
 - iii. (E. Conde): clarified that this is not an outcome of the strike. Some campuses are older than CSUCI so they are experiencing facilities being outdated.
 - iv. Yielded time: (H. Alatorre) Advisor clarified that this fund is for them to operate and it's separate from the infrastructure funding. Also informed Senate that funds are separate and each one is for something different.
 - v. Yielded time: (C. Pelletier) Chief of Staff asked regarding housing to ask how many floors are unoccupied here in CSUCI housing.
 - vi. Chair: (R. Banda) Vice President clarified that a few floors are unoccupied and Basic Needs goes through a process to provide emergency housing for unhoused students.
 - vii. Senate (Bohn-Reinhardt): added that there are unhoused Veteran students here at CSUCI.
 - viii. Senate (E. Escalera): noted that the Basic Needs emergency housing program is temporary, and it's a long process, but they can look into it.
 - ix. Senate (E. Escalera) : spoke about CSUnity and learning about an organization that helps unhoused students within the CSU. And noted that they will research more about that and possibly reach out to basic needs.
 - x. Yielded time (H. Alatorre): Advisor It costs to operate and for an area to be affordable housing you must qualify, and the facility also must qualify and to support qualified students we need to be recognized as affordable housing. For more questions, reach out to housing to find out more.
