 - 2. Has been working with senator (J. Paz) on another resolution.
 - iii. A. Clark – Senator of Academics & Technology
 - 1. Working with their intern to see how chatbot can assist students and go to different centers to see how that would look like.
 - iv. A. Bohn-Reinhardt – Senator of Veterans/Non-Traditional
 - 1. Working with (R. Banda) to connect with Chief Massey to discuss Veteran parking.
 - 2. Advocating for Veteran housing for students on campus.
 - v. J. Paz– Senator of Sports/Rec./Wellness
 - 1. Working on a resolution regarding alert systems at CSUCI.
- b. Executive Reports:
- i. President Report (*E. Conde*)
 - 1. Attended a SRPC meeting, Interim President presented on the budget and discussed the creation of a subcommittee that will take a deeper look at potential areas. In the SPRC they have been meeting frequently to stay on top of the work.
 - 2. April 7th, the Interim President will be hosting a University Open Forum on Budget. At the Smith Decision Center (SMI 1908) and via webinar.
 - 3. Today they have the first BASC meeting.
 - 4. Started working with Chief Justice Williams and Associate Justice Hernandez to review our bylaws and identify any updates or changes that may be needed.
 - ii. Vice President Report (*R. Banda*)
 - 1. Worked on meeting with Senators for their one on ones
 - 2. Connecting Senators with Campus partners to address possible resolutions
 - 3. Met with Interim President Andrzejewski alongside President Conde to discuss the recent student passings and mental health resources
 - iii. Director of Operations Report (*N. Raygoza*)
 - 1. Completed the minutes from last week’s Senate meeting.
 - 2. Posted our special guest Jacqui Irwin visiting our Senate.
 - 3. Working with their intern on different social media outreach.
 - iv. Chief of Staff Report (*C. Pelletier*)
 - 1. Worked on a presentation to engage in the vote championship.
 - 2. During the last CSSA plenary they spoke about different bills and shared information.

3. SB 1006 (Padilla): Would increase the Cal Grant B access award and adjust annually based on CPI. It was clarified that the award would not decrease if CPI drops. With this information, Carol Pelletier voted in support of SB 1006.
4. AB 2236 (Berman): Aims to streamline transfer agreements by using a common course numbering system, making it easier for students to transfer credits and save time/money. However, concerns about limiting faculty discretion on course equivalencies, this led to Carol Pelletier's abstention.
5. System Wide Affairs spoke about information on the impact of federal HSI/MSI grant cuts was requested and will be shared when available.
6. (System Wide Affairs: A resolution opposing CSU Presidential compensation increases was presented.
7. (System Wide Affairs: A resolution on CSU Alternative Consultation Process reforms was discussed, focused on transparency, student involvement, and concerns over administrative authority in fees.

i. Advisor Helen Alatorre

1. The door remains open for any senators who wish to meet, and several senators have already taken advantage of this opportunity to successfully connect with campus partners.
2. Election campaigning started Monday, March 30th. It was shared that candidates should actively market themselves, so the student body is aware of who they are.
3. Voting will take place April 14th-15th and will be conducted electronically through CI Sync, with authentication ensuring one vote per student.

a. INFORMATIONAL ITEM: CSSA (*E. Conde*)

1. During CSSA they spoke about the SIRQ Fee (Student Involvement Representation Fee).
2. The SIRQ fee helps advocacy opportunities, and this fee is something students can choose to opt out of.

3. CSSA finance committee aims to make plenary registration affordable or free so all campuses can participate.

1. Yielded time (H. Alatorre): Asked what CSSA said about the SIRF fee because in the past CSUCI has had the lowest pay rate.
 2. President (E. Conde): clarified that CSSA hasn't expressed any concerns with our campus. The Board of Directors spoke about it and they want to bring it to the attention of students.

1. Gave information regarding the primaries and links to research what will be on the ballot.
 2. Voter registration upcoming tabling dates will be shared soon.
- c. DISCUSSION ITEM: Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin (*J. Irwin*) [Time Certain: 10:30-11AM]
1. Spoke about their background and gave information regarding bills they authored.
 2. Spoke about their day to day from flying to Sacramento and coming back to her district office.
 3. Gave insight on how they get ideas for bills that benefit the community.
 4. Spoke about red flag laws and gave an example.
 5. Currently, they are hosting scam workshops to help seniors because it informs them a lot about new technology.
