b. DISCUSSION ITEM: Resolutions (*R.Banda, H. Alatorre*)

Discussion:

1. Senator (E. Escalera) spoke to a representative from housing (Rachel Tafoya) about accessibility with door buttons and doors within housing areas to make it easier for students within housing.
2. It was noted that facility directors make sure we are ADA compliant for each building.
3. A consideration could be to compare the buttons to another CSU campus and see if it must be due with enrollment or what area focuses on this.
4. Noted, it can be difficult to reach out to housing and get a response because they receive many emails a day.

Discussion:

5. Senator (J. Paz) spoke about going to campus partners' offices to leave a note or reach out to let them know you emailed them.
6. Senator K. Munoz inquired about streamlining the carpool parking pass due to having to go in person to verify you and another person are carpooling.
7. Senator (A. Bon-Reinhardt) is meeting with Chief Massey next week, and some of these questions can be brought up.
8. Yielded Time: C. Pelletier: mentioned an experience with carpool and the verification requiring two students to be present for the pass.

9. K. Munoz: mentioned that other people can also bring a random friend so they can't always confirm.
10. Senator K. Munoz recognizes that as a commuter student, they want students to be aware of the options and how it can be convenient for students.

Discussion:

11. Senator (J. Paz): said he sent the chief an email with questions for the meeting, so he could also investigate more into the topic beforehand.
12. Senator (J. Paz) spoke about incidents and how students can see emergencies faster on text message alerts.

Discussion:

13. Senator (J. Paz) mentioned that the soccer field has potholes, and the recommendation from the chair is to get these students to come forward and discuss these different issues.

14. Senator J. Paz spoke about drop-in academic advising and the challenges with 10-minute consultations.
15. Yielded time: C. Pelletier mentioned that drop-in academic advising can be very short and confusing when they don't have counselors for each major.

16. Yielded time (Araya Singh): her and Adrian were talking about the chatbot because we have one already which is named Ekhubot, CSUN has a chatbot on the website and it could be trained to be specific for departments.
17. It was noted that the chatbot used to exist during covid, but it was removed due to low utilization.
18. A great question is to think we should inquire about the website remodeling versus using a chatbot since each individual website has to gather information for the chatbot.
19. Yielded time: (C. Pelletier) types in feedback on the search in CSUCI and the responses are from 2020-2021, and she wants to Ekho that the website is something that we need to emphasize remodeling on.
